RESPECT LIFE MONTH

All during the month of October we are reminded that the Catholic Church in the United States sets aside this month to accentuate the “dignity of human life” from the very first moment of conception until one is called home by God to the heavenly kingdom. Humans are forbidden to interfere with this process so that abortion on the one hand, and euthanasia on the other is outside the realm of human power. Dignity for human life also includes the respect of others in a multitude of ways. Racism and sexism are violations of this dignity. Non-concern for the physically and mentally challenged, as well as avoidance of the poor and needy is also violation of the dignity of human life. We ask all members of our Parish Family to pray each day that all persons will come to realize the importance of human life and make this month a time when the teaching of the Catholic Church is understood and appreciated by the entire country.
