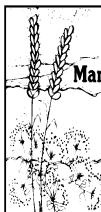

ANOINTING OF THE SICK

The communal Anointing of the Sick will take place during the **10:00 A. M. Mass on Tuesday, May 19, 2009.** The Second Vatican Council in its Constitution on the Sacred Liturgy, moved away from the popular understanding that if someone was anointed, death was eminent. It states that the anointing of the sick "is not a sacrament for those only who are at the point of death" (No. 73). Rites for the anointing of the sick were revised to make it clear that the anointing may be given to anyone who is seriously ill, with the hope that the person might be restored to health. Among the categories of people whom the General Instruction mentions as appropriate candidates for the sacrament are those undergoing surgery; the elderly, even if no serious illness is present; and sick children, if they have sufficient use of reason (see Nos. 10-12) Call Sister Lois, 412.486.4021 if you need transportation to the Communal Anointing of the Sick Mass.
