

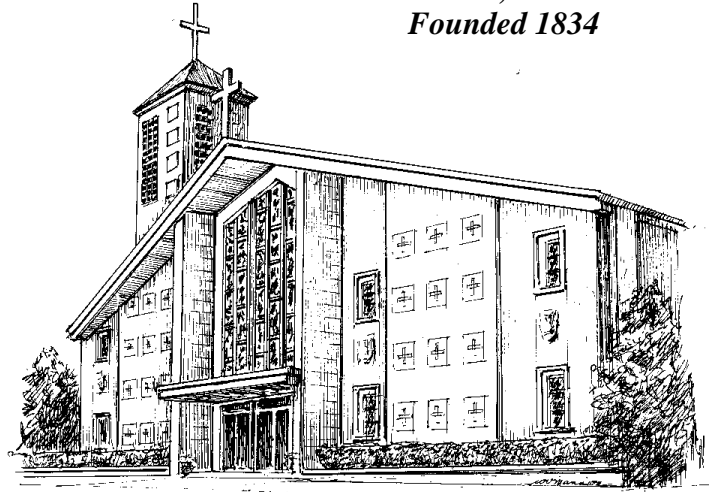

## PARISH FESTIVAL REPORT

## ONE BODY, ONE MISSION (part 4)

This 84 page document is divided into three basic sections with an introduction and conclusion. This document sets forth "the theological framework for both who we are and what we do." The INTRODUCTION outlines the purpose and use of the guidelines, and a brief history of Parish Pastoral Councils. Any member of our Parish Family who might be interested in serving on our Council might enter into a discerning process to determine if this is the ministry for him or her. Reading this document will help the person make that decision.
